

OVERVIEW: Rattlesnake Creek, Poway, CA

When the Poway Redevelopment Agency in San Diego County required improvements for Rattlesnake Creek to enhance the future home of a new Police Station, Library, and Community Park, they looked no further than Armorflex for the flood protection.

The City of Poway has a history with Armorflex. One of the very first projects in California incorporating Armorflex in flood protection design was Poway Creek in 1988. With the success of Poway Creek and other projects in the county, the Poway Redevelopment Agency chose Armorflex as their hard-armor flood protection for Rattlesnake Creek.

Aarmorflex Class 50 blocks were used to allow for maximum vegetation and to give the channel a natural looking appearance. Today, the majority of the Armorflex can be hard to see except when large events wash away some of the vegetation and soil from the blocks.
